

1 Fur, Feathers and Scales: Animal Update

During this quarter, the Balasaheb Thackeray Gorewada International Zoological Park (BTGIZP) has further strengthened its wildlife collection and conservation initiatives through notable acquisitions and rescues. As part of animal exchange program with Sayajibaug Zoological Garden, Vadodara, the zoo received several new species, including Zebra Finch, Comb Duck, Night Heron, and Rosy-Faced Lovebird. Additionally,

the Thane Forest Division conducted a raid to seize various illegally held animals from a private individual. These animals were subsequently entrusted to BTGIZP for captive care until further instructions. The consignment includes six Ball Pythons, one Orangutan, one Indian Star Tortoise, six Tri-carinate Hill Terrapins, one Green Iguana, and one Golden Reticulated Python.


Births




5 Events & Celebrations:

Katrina

A Story Sweeter Than Honey

It was the beginning of 2018 when a female sloth bear's fate took a tragic turn. Caught in a wire snare, in an open forest her front right paw was severely injured. In her desperate struggle to escape, the wire cut deep into her muscles, reaching the bone. By the time the forest department rescue team arrived, gangrene had set in, leaving no option but to amputate her paw.

With her disability, survival in the wild was impossible. Katrina, as she was later named, was sent to a rescue center, where she spent the next four years. During this time, she enjoyed company of several orphaned bear cubs, but as they grew and were moved to zoos, she was left alone. When the breeding season arrived, Katrina's loneliness became evident—she became restless, irritable, and even aggressive. Despite good nutrition, her hair started falling out, and she would spit and scream at anyone who approached her.
